CTUR is the Thematic Network of the URBACT II Programme that focuses on the Cruise Traffic and Urban Regeneration of city port heritage as a key for sustainable economic, social and urban development; enquiring into how port-cities can be productive and no longer simple transit areas through cruise tourism activity.

The three CTUR general themes analyzed in the framework of the integrated approach are:

1. Transforming, regenerating and adapting the physical and environmental components of the 'city-port system': increasing the attractiveness of the port city
2. Cruise traffic and port heritage as economic and social benefits
3. Planning and managing cruise development within a global port-city project

 - provide a greater range of facilities (infrastructure and services) to support cruise tourism.
