



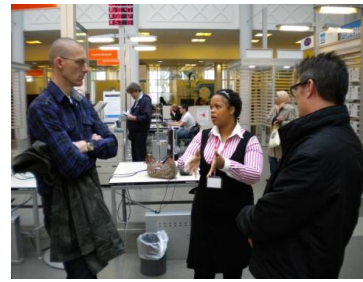

YCC: RAC and WAC counsellors, and C-stick inspiration
What tips would you give other MG partners from this experience?	Plan your trip well and do perhaps not attempt as many activities as we did. Do substantial research beforehand so the discussions can be enhanced. Think about how you can return the favour/hospitality in the future.
What actions will you take when you get back home based on this study visit?	Learn from Community School coaching methods. Use B&W Next ideas/tips in the Gothenburg context. Integrate lessons from the two different EYC experiences into the Gothenburg application. Consider ways to develop the C-stick ideas from the YCC.
