The main issue is the vital need for successful socio-economic re-use of abandoned military heritage sites to harness sustainable urban development.

Project Repair will focus on developing innovative new local policy, placing sustainable urban development at the heart of regeneration action to achieve the socio-economic

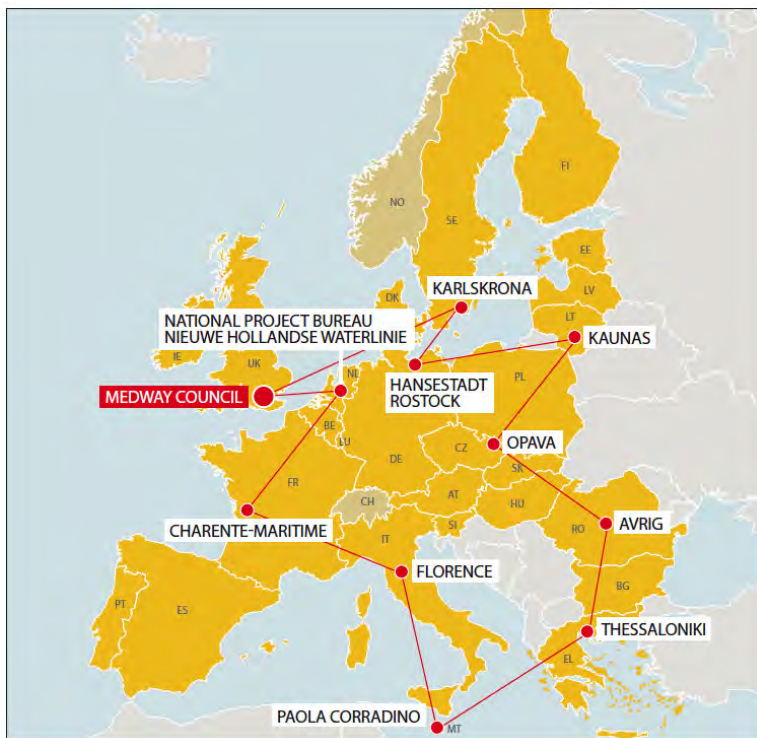
