Integrated Action Plan (IAP)

An IAP offers cities a **concrete response** to their policy challenge. The IAP follows an **intervention logic** which aims to **design** and implement **actions based on testing**. The IAP will link the cities actions to the broader **Cohesion Policy funds** to support **long term implementation** and lasting change.

Lead Partner





Lead Partner role and responsabilities

Lead Partners are key actors of transnational partnerships for Action Planning Networks.

Lead Partners complete and submit the Application form and all requested documents to the URBACT Joint Secretariat

They have full responsibility for:

- √ network management,
- ✓ coordination of activities among the transnational partners, and
- √ implementation of the work programme.

The Lead Partner also bears **financial and legal responsibility and liability** for the whole partnership towards the Managing Authority.



Lead Partner's recommended team

Sufficient human resources should be allocated to ensure suitable project management for a Lead Partner. **We recommend at least the equivalent of 2 full-time posts.**

The Lead Partner should therefore appoint:

- A Project Coordinator Full-time.
- A Finance Officer Usually a half-time post.
- A Communication Officer Usually a half-time post.



Project Partners' responsibilities

Even though the Lead Partner shall be administratively, legally and financially responsible for the project, <u>each Project Partner shall commit to the success of the project and contribute to its implementation and completion.</u>

Moreover, each partner remains liable for the sound financial management of its own expenditure.

The equivalent of 1 full-time post is recommended. Each Project Partner should therefore appoint:

- A Project Coordinator Usually a half time position.
- A **Finance Officer** half time position is strongly recommended.



Main beneficiaries

Institutions from:

- 27 EU Members States
- Partner States (Switzerland and Norway)
- 3. IPA countries (Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Montenegro, North Macedonia and Serbia)*
- **4.** Other countries (but at own costs)

« CITIES »:

- Cities, municipalities, towns
- Local agencies defined as public or semi-public organisations set up by a city
- Infra-municipal tiers of government such as city districts and boroughs
- Metropolitan authorities and organised agglomerations

No limitations in terms of size and population

*5 IPA countries novelty – check carefully if the legal framework is fully set and in place in a particular IPA country

« NON - CITIES »:

- Universities and research centres,
- Provincial / Regional authorities,
- Managing Authorities (EU Cohesion and solidarity funds)





Eligibility as Lead partner

- Only Cities Partner can be Lead Partner
- Only Cities from the 27 EU Member States can be Lead Partner
- A candidate City can be Lead Partner in only one Urbact proposal




Eligibility requirements for the partnership

- ✓ 2 "non-city partners" allowed per network
- ✓ A beneficiary can be a partner in max. 2 approved networks
- ✓ A city can be a candidate Lead Partner of one Action Planning
 Network proposal only (but can be additionally a Project Partner in
 another network)
- ✓ Only cities from the 27 EU MS can be Lead Partners under this call
- ✓ A partnership must include partners from at least 7 different countries




Partnership balance

Partnership balance



- More Developed Regions
- Less Developed Regions & Regions in Transition

- Partners from non-EU countries not counted in this geographical coverage of EU region types.
- ✓ a min. 6 partners from Less
 Developed and Transition Regions
 where the total number of partners
 is 8 to 9.
- ✓ a minimum of 7 partners from Less Developed and Transition Regions where the total number of partners is 10.
- ✓ Example with partner from IPA country: 8 network partners 1 IPA partner = 7 EU partners x 70% = 5 EU partners from Less and transition



The map showing the categorisation of EU Regions for 2021-2027 can be found <u>here</u>.




ESSENTIAL CONSIDERATIONS in partner search



Keep in mind the ASSESSMENT CRITERIA

Criterion 3: Quality and Relevance of Partnership (35%) – the criterion with the highest weighting

For this criterion, assessors will more especially consider the following dimensions:







Draft a QUESTIONNAIRE based on the application form requirements

- Example of Questionnaire template provided in the Guide for Applicants
- Test responsiveness
- Analyze profiles (commitment, motivation, needs, added value)
- Gather a shortlist of partner candidates
- Make final selection for the network proposal
- ! Keep the reserve (in case of last minute drop-outs)



Keep in mind the ELIGIBILITY

- A city can be a Lead Partner in <u>only one network proposal</u>
 (and project partner in another network)
- A city can be a Project Partner in only two approved networks
 ! Check multiple commitments
- Questionnaire

! Test the commitment to:

- o Perform expected activities and tasks at transnational and local level
- o Engage with local stakeholders
- o Mobilise the resources needed (human, time and financial)



Submission procedure (Lead partners responsibility)

2 steps required to submit your application:

- 1 Online submission of the <u>application form</u> through the SYNERGIE-CTE system in English by 31 March 2023 at 15:00 CEST
 - information on the SYNERGIE system outlined in the Guide to SYNERGIE (available soon on urbact.eu/get-involved)
- 2 Send the application package by email to APN@urbact.eu by

3 April 2023 at 15:00 CEST

• including scan of the signed PDF of the application generated through SYNERGIE-CTE, <u>signed letters of commitment</u> and all additional requested documents
