Who is the Lead Partner?

- ✓ Only cities having implemented a project funded under Urban Innovative Actions (2016-2023) can be Lead Partners
- ✓ A city can be a candidate Lead Partner of one Innovation Transfer Network proposal only (but can be additionally a Project Partner in another network)





Lead Partner role and responsabilities

Lead Partners are key actors of transnational partnerships for Innovation Transfer Networks.

Lead Partners complete and submit the Application form and all requested documents to the URBACT Joint Secretariat

They have full responsibility for:

- √ network management,
- ✓ coordination of activities among the transnational partners, and
- √ implementation of the work programme.

The Lead Partner also bears **financial and legal responsibility and liability** for the whole partnership towards the Managing Authority.





Who can be a **Project Partner?**

✓ City or non-city partner who answer the eligibility requirements





City? Non-City?

« CITIES »:

- Cities, municipalities, towns
- Local agencies defined as public or semi-public organisations set up by a city
- Infra-municipal tiers of government such as city districts and boroughs
- Metropolitan authorities and organised agglomerations

No limitations in terms of size and population

« NON - CITIES »:

- Universities and research centres
- Provincial/ Regional authorities
- Managing Authorities (EU Cohesion and solidarity funds)

Public authorities or Equivalent public bodies





- ✓ A beneficiary can be a partner in max. 2 approved networks
- ✓ A partnership cannot include more than one partner from the same country
- ✓ 1 "non-city partner" allowed per network
- √ Geographical balance

Which countries can participate?

Institutions from:

- 1. 27 EU Members States
- **2. Partner States** (Switzerland and Norway)
- 3. Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Montenegro, North Macedonia and Serbia (countries benefitting from the **Instrument for Pre-Accession** to the EU)





What is the Geographical balance?

EU Regions balance

- Partnership of 5 to 6 partners: minimum of 3 partners from Less Developed and Transition EU Regions
- Partnership of 7 partners:
 minimum of 4 partners from Less Developed
 and Transition EU Regions





What is the Geographical balance?

>>> To complete the partnership:

- Partners from all types of EU Regions (More developed, in transition or less developed)
- Partners from Norway, Switzerland and IPA Countries (Max. 1 per partnership!)

>>> In terms of assessment, it is recommended to build a diverse partnership, also involving partners from more developed countries







- 5 to 7 partners (Lead Partner included)
- Lead Partner only from UIA-funded cities (2016-2023)
- Project Partner can be CITY or NON-CITY
 - o If non-city, max. 1 per network allowed
- Project Partner in max. 2 approved networks
- <u>Each</u> partner from a <u>different</u> country
- Partners from all types of EU Regions:
 - Thresholds of Regional Balance
 - Partnership of 7: minimum of 4 partners from Less Developed and Transition EU Regions
 - Partnerships of 5 or 6: minimum of 3 partners from Less Developed and Transition EU Regions
 - Max. 1 from IPA or Switzerland or Norway per network



Keep in mind the ASSESSMENT CRITERIA

Criterion 1: Relevance of the UIA practice and quality of the partnership (20%)

For this criterion, assessors will more especially consider the following dimensions:

Keep in mind the RELEVANCE

- The challenge addressed is a **priority for all network partners**.
- The **experiences of all network partners are relevant** and will contribute to the learning process of the whole partnership.
- For **certain topics** the **size and positioning of the city** could be important comparable elements for the coherence check of partners' local situations i.e. maritime cities working on maritime issues.
- There is a clear understanding of the **added value** an involvement in an URBACT network will bring to the partner in relation to respective capacity building needs.





Keep in mind the ELIGIBILITY

A city can be a Lead Partner in <u>only one network proposal</u>
 (and project partner in another network)

A city can be a Project Partner in only two <u>approved</u> networks



Tips for candidate Project Partners

Demonstrate relevance

- How is the policy challenge relevant for you?
- What is your experience on the topic? (e.g. existing policies, strategies and actions developed by your city in relation to the policy challenge)
- How is your city relevant to adapt and transfer the target innovation?

Demonstrate motivation

- What is your motivation to join this network?
- What is the added value that URBACT would bring to the city in terms of learning and capacity-building?
- What do you expect from a transnational network?

Demonstrate commitment

- What could be the scope of the Investement plan to be produced within the framework of the network?
- Which resources (human, time, financial) are you willing to engage?
- Who are you envisioning in the initial URBACT Local Group?
- What is your experience in working through transnational exchange?





Tips for candidate Lead Partners



Check for multiple commitments of Project Partners



Test the commitment to:

- Perform expected activities and tasks at transnational and local level
- Engage with local stakeholders
- Mobilise the resources needed (human, time and financial)



Tips for candidate Lead Partners

Draft a QUESTIONNAIRE based on the application form requirements

- Example of Questionnaire template provided in the Guide for Applicants (page 30)
- Test responsiveness
- Analyse profiles (commitment, motivation, needs, added value)
- Gather a shortlist of partner candidates
- Make final selection for the network proposal



Keep the reserve (in case of last minute drop-outs)





Essential considerations in partner search

7 Tips for a great partnership

- 1. There is no such thing as the "perfect size"
- 2. Ensure the **geographical balance!**
- 3. Welcome newcomers!
- 4. Test the commitment
- 5. Beware of not-responsive partners
- 6. Connect to the available resources (URBACT Secretariat, National URBACT Points...)
- 7. Take time to **know the partner**
