#### As Lead Partner, how do you see the beginning of the In4Green journey?

I consider that we are making positive progress in the project. My perception is influenced by the level of commitment I observe from the cities and individuals involved. I highlight the constructive collaboration in our meetings, which is encouraging. Although I cannot predict with certainty how things will unfold in the coming months, the evidence of genuine interest in achieving results leaves me optimistic. In my view, this is a good start for the second phase of the project, and I hope we can maintain this positive momentum.

#### What would you highlight about the team involved in In4Green network?

While acknowledging potential challenges in aligning efforts with objectives, I highlight the significant groundwork laid in inter-city collaboration. Additionally, I commend the collective efforts of individuals and technical teams in fostering a collaborative work environment.

Attending transnational meetings reinforces our commitment, and I believe we have a solid foundation for progress.

#### How do you assess the reception of your shared good practices by the other partners?

On the day of my presentation at the transnational meeting **the queries I received were**particularly relevant. They focused on crucial aspects of our successful practices, such as
managing public-private collaborations and navigating agreements with unions and businesses.

These inquiries delved into how we achieved consensus on key issues like infrastructure, business attraction, and social services. Funding was also a central topic, with questions probing the strategies behind securing adequate financing. Ultimately, **the goal of collaboration is to ensure**that available funds are utilized effectively to serve the interests of all stakeholders in the city.

#### What do you hope to achieve locally in Avilés with the project?

As Lead Partner, we have high expectations, particularly regarding building relationships. Over time, we naturally develop closer connections with some cities than others, discovering shared interests along the way. Currently, our focus lies heavily on attracting investments and developing land. We seek insights from other places on integrating these areas more seamlessly into the city, moving away from the past approach where industry operated independently from urban development. We're also exploring how mobility intersects with these efforts and how companies can innovate to add value within the local context.



THE LEAD EXPERT'S POINT OF VIEW.

A network of people and cities making good progress towards the green transition.

The URBACT In4Green network has now passed the first quarter of the second stage of the APN journey. By now almost all partners have their **URBACT Local Groups fully up and running**, analysing local **problems**, agreeing on the main **focus** of the Integrated Action Plan and identifying possible **testing actions**.

Being my first experience as Lead Expert of a URBACT network, I must admit that it was an exciting and thrilling moment when we finally received the green light for the methodology and the roadmap of the network. I also have to admit that **it was a challenge to set the machinery in motion**. The network roadmap is very ambitious because **the potential of the network partners and the possibilities for exchange and collaborative learning are enormous**. On the other hand, the main topic of In4Green is a challenging one: to achieve the green transition in industrial cities.

With this challenge in mind, the network partners have been able to achieve important milestones in this quarter such as the organisation of the second Transnational Meeting in Solingen, which was a great opportunity for engaging in activities such as study visits, peer reviews, presentation of good practices and deepening of the URBACT methodology.


