

Call – Spring 2024







WHAT IS A TRANSFER NETWORK?

An URBACT Good Practice City







Call for Transfer Networks – Main features



- Partnership: 6-8 partners including Good Practice City
- Eligible Lead Partner: 116 Good Practices selected in 2024
- Eligible Partners: all EU cities, Switzerland, Norway, IPA and NDICI countries
- Duration: 30 months (from 1/11/2025 to 30/04/2028)
- Budget: 750 000€





Partnership - Eligibility requirements



- ✓ Only cities with a 2024 URBACT Good Practice can be Lead Partners under this call
- ✓ A city can be a candidate Lead Partner of one Transfer Network proposal only (but can be additionally a Project Partner in another network)
- ✓ A beneficiary can be a partner in max. 2 approved networks
- ✓ A partnership cannot include more than one partner from the same country
- ✓ 1 "non-city partner" allowed per network

Geographical balance

- a network must involve partners from at least 6 different countries (in case of a 6 partners), of which at least 2 from EU Member States (including the Good Practice city)
- from the EU partners (minimum 2, maximum all partners), at least half should be located in Less Developed and Transition EU Regions.

>>> In terms of assessment, it is recommended to build a diverse partnership





WHY APPLY TO A TRANSFER NETWORK?

URBACT Good Practice City

- To lead & mentor the process of understanding, adapting and reusing your good practice.
- To benefit from visibility & communication activities at EU and national levels
- To try out new methods related to your Good Practices thanks to Testing Actions
- To upscale and improve the Good Practice thanks to the URBACT method & inputs from other EU cities

Transfer Cities

- To adapt & re-use a tested and effective practice in their own city context
- To tackle a specific policy challenge with an integrated and sustainable solution
- To learn from the process & document it through a Transfer
 Plan

- **✓** Benefit from the support of URBACT experts
- **✓** Benefit from the involvement of local stakeholders
- ✓ Enjoy a safe space for experimentation

Network level

- A Transferabilty Study UNDERSTAND stage
- A Communication Plan UNDERSTAND stage
- Transnational Network meetings (at least 6)
- Quarterly Network Journals (6 during UNDERSTAND & ADAPT stage)
- Network Articles (at least 3)
- Final Network Report

Local level

- A URBACT Local group
- A **Transfer Plan** (Roadmap & Report) *For Transfer partners*
- An Improvement Plan For Good Practice Cities

+ Additional customised set of Exchange & Learning and Communication activities to be decided by the partnership





Transferability Study

- ✓ A detailed description of the Good Practice and its transfer potential, placing it within the context of the EU's urban policy priorities
- ✓ A review or the transfer context in each of the transfer partner cities
- ✓ The network's bespoke exchange and learning methodology based on the identified assets and barriers to transfer and implementation

- ✓ Highlights local assets and barriers to transfer and implementation
- ✓ Takes account of key factors such as local strategic priorities, levels of political support and potential funding sources
- ✓ Sets the basis for a unique "network roadmap" with a detailed workplan of activities at transnational and local level





Transfer Plan for Transfer Cities

- ✓ A needs analysis establishing the rationale for transferring the Good Practice
- ✓ A detailed description of the Good Practice, including its results and evidence of impact
- ✓ A detailed outline of the modules of the Good practice to be adapted

- ✓ Details of the partnership delivery model including roles and responsibilities
- ✓ A schedule of activities, outputs and outcomes
- ✓ Lessons learned during the transfer process
- ✓ Expected ways to further work on the Good Practice after the end of the Transfer Network





Improvement Plan for Lead Partners

- ✓ tailored to the Good Practice city's needs and priorities
- ✓ each Lead Partner will determine its own set of activities, supported by the network Lead Expert

Expected benefits:

- ✓ Enhancing the city's profile as a lead player in the network's policy area
- ✓ Gathering suggestions for improvement of the Good Practice from the network's peer review activities
- Sustaining, improving and possibly upscaling the practice and reviewing it considering the cross-cutting principles of Green transition, Digital Transition and Gender equality.





SHAPING NETWORK ACTIVITIES - key points

- ✓ Different lengths of transnational network activities
- ✓ Meetings should be interactive, stimulating and enjoyable
- ✓ Thematic focus type of stakeholders type of activities proposed (expert input, 'Forensic' site visits, peer review exercises, group problem-solving, structured discussions and analysis sessions using dynamic facilitation techniques, ...)
- ✓ Key role of local stakeholders
- ✓ Advance planning



SHAPING NETWORK ACTIVITIES – tools for learning and knowledge uptake

FOR EXAMPLE

- ✓ Pre- and post-meeting briefing notes: capture and document the E&L rationale
- ✓ **Different tools to capture learning**: includes key learning points for each partner and actions to be carried out at local level, helps partners record the history of learning and monitor actions throughout the journey
- ✓ Support and follow up materials: materials, handouts, produced for/at network activities that can help ULG participants design debriefings at local level




Developing your proposals around exchange and learning activities

EXAMINE **assessment criteria** in the Terms of Reference





Keep in mind

- Transfer / Improvement plans: a driver of the transnational exchange & learning activities as well as a concrete output of the participation in the Network
- The transfer journey, although a shared experience, is ultimately a unique / tailor-made one for each transfer partner. Adaptation of the original Good Practice and preparation for reuse is made in a format that reflects the new local context.
- The lessons learnt during the transnational activities will inspire partners to adapt this knowledge at local level, develop skills relating to the good practice and co-design a robust Transfer process with peers.

EXPERTISE SUPPORT





Expertise support

Additional envelope of 120 000€ for expertise support > Up to 160 expertise days available

- **Network Lead expert supports** the network over the <u>entire</u> duration of the network
- Several network Ad-Hoc Experts providing specific support on a particular policy subject, methodology, communications...
- Experts are selected from the URBACT IV pool of validated experts available on the URBACT website







Expertise support

- Production of the Transferability Study
- Development of the **network methodology**, including the potential modularisation of the good practice
- Support for setting up URBACT Local Groups in each partner city
- Expertise for the design and delivery of transnational exchange and learning activities in collaboration with partners
- Thematic expertise related to the policy challenge being addressed
- Support partners in applying integrated and participatory approaches
- Support partners with the design and peer review of their Final Transfer Reports.
- Support the Lead Partner to produce Improvement Plans
- Production of **key network outputs** and contribution to **programme-level activities** on relevant topics
- Advice to Lead and Transfer Partners on testing actions



Lead Expert Selection



- 1. Expertise needs and criteria for the selection of network experts shall be provided in the application form based on URBACT expertise framework outlined in the ToR and Guide
- 2. After the approval of Transfer Networks, experts validated in the URBACT pool will be invited to express their interest in becoming Lead Expert of an TN
- **3. URBACT Secretariat will check suitability** in coherence with the Application Form
- 4. Final selection agreed with the Lead partner based on interviews with candidates
