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## 1 - About ARCHETHICS Network

#### The Network

ARCHETHICS Network fosters a deep reflection on the **Dissonant Heritage** present in many European cities.

## **What Dissonant Heritage means**

The history of Europe has generated an heritage that sometimes is controversial and complex due to belonging to totalitarian regimes or contentious borders. This heritage has been called "Dissonant", addressing the problematic link between the physical elements like architecture, neighbourhoods, monuments, urban public spaces, and the historical and political values those elements represent.

The Network allows to experience the complex history of Europe and, through a critical examination of the past, come into the present to promote democracy and solidarity.

The objective of ARCHETHICS is to explore novel approaches to build sustainable urban policies on Dissonant Heritage to:


- enhance dissonant heritage as a nondivisive element of urban **communities**, but as a starting point for shaping new democratic identities;
- generate a better understanding on how sustainable managing Dissonant Heritage;
- activate urban community labs around European common values;
- open new perspectives and opportunities to enhance Dissonant Heritage as an investment attraction and a driver for local touristic and cultural development.













1 - What happened

from June to September 2025?

Last Core Network meeting of ARCHETHICS and the preparation for the final stage of the the project

From June to October 2025, ARCHETHICS
Network moved forward the last project stage.
The **preparation of the final product** has been followed through interactive sessions organised during the last **core network meeting held in Leipzig**.

Project partners organised at local level testing actions, dissemination project event and last meetings with the URBACT Local groups. In this project journal the **testing activities** developed by **Vila Nova de Cerveira** and **Cesena** are shared as well as the first ready network output: **the outline of a digital archive of dissonant heritage**.
















## Visiting the dissonant heritage area of Leipzig

ARCHETHICS delegation visited "Matthäikirchhof" area, that was the birthplace of Leipzig the largest city of Saxony in East Germany. It was raised to ground on 4th of December 1943. In 1985 the ministry of state security (Stasi) built its regional headquarters in this area.

For three decades, this huge dissonant area of 1.8 ha, located in the city center has been dormant and neglected.

This artefact reflect the problematic legacy of the GDR and its controversial past histories and it commemorative significance.

The city of Leipzig is willing to transform this huge 'non-space' into a novel and vital part of the city with the aim of symbolising its vivid democratic environment.






















Visiting the City History Museum

ARCHETHICS partners visited the exhibition "A new dawn and the end of a system. The 1990s in Leipzig" at City History Museum of Leipzig.

The exhibition showed the everyday life in Leipzig in the 1990s. Indeed that time heralded a tumultuous period full of both opportunities and challenges. After the peaceful revolution and the end of the GDR, the possibilities seemed almost endless: techno parties, squatting, sports events highlighted in the media, and new festivals.

Culture was more open, and urban politics became more democratic. But at the same time the loss of job, the transformation of the economic sector and regeneration of several urban areas have made the 1990s a period of change for Leipzig citizens full of hope for future but difficulties.



















## **Charter and Common Glossary for an** ethical and cultural approach on **Dissonant Heritage**

Sandra Rainero, URBACT ad hoc expert and expert on culture and communication, guided partners through a WRITE STORMING to cocreate the ARCHETHICS common glossary. The glossary is a collection of words, not exhaustive, but that represents for partners their values and experiences related to the ARCHETHICS work done so far.

The charter and the common glossary are among the most important project outputs.





Eight terms dealing with dissonant heritage were discussed and presented:

- dissonant heritage
- memories
- complexity
- stories
- resistance
- forgotten
- processing (trauma)
- empathy.

In the second part of the workshop, a "Haiku poetry session" was facilitated to let partners reflect on the eight terms of the glossary and express themselves using a more emotional language.

Partners worked enthusiastically producing **several Haiku** that were shared among participants.

That product will compose the network output linking dissonant words with significance through poetry.
















## **ARCHETHICS** meets the Urban Agenda for Culture and Cultural Heritage coordinator

## Creative sessions for co-designing the outputs: ARCHETHICS Living Lab & Action planning journey

Ileana Toscano, URBACT lead expert, guided partners to a co-design session on "ARCHETHICS Living Lab as Operational governance tool result of the work with the **ULG** aimed at long term IAP".

ARCHETHICS has a sound legacy about participation through the participative methodology used by the network: from the local level work with city stakeholders to the interactive participative workshops done between partners.





Partners shared insights on:

- A good experience they had of participation
- the role of the Municipality to foster a participative /multi-perspective approach
- successful approach to communicate with citizens and stakeholders about dissonant heritage
- Ideas to keep engaged citizens after the end of ARCHETHICS project
- best tips for other cities on citizens engagement to enhance dissonant heritage

Following, a *charrette* workshop was facilitate to harvest insights from partners about the research questions of the four project dimensions (architecture, history, people, ethics) that guided the work along 2 years of project development.

Answering the questions, participants drew how their city has approached the 4 dimensions and shared tips and insights on the process and possible improvements.

















## 3 - BILATERAL MEETINGS IN LEIPZIG & KAZANLAK

# Leipzig - How can we talk about Dissonant Heritage?

On the 3 July 2025 tha Bilateral exchange on "Communicating Dissonance" took place in Leipzig. Talking about dissonant heritage could result complicated due to the complex issues this heritage rapresentes. The bilateral exchange was organised to focus on communication, tools and practical experiences for involving communities in the debate on Dissonant Heritage.

Sara Galeotti presented a few cases studies implemented by her organisation "La casa del cuculo". The examples showed to participants how communication and art could foster difficult concepts and involve citizens.

**Public art** workshops, Partecipative **guerrilla art**, **You've got mail** format and **photovoice** have been the communication/artistic techniques shared with participants.

The participating cities (**Betera**, **Permet**, **Cesena**, **Gdansk and Leipzig**) were involved in a practical activity to test some communication tools to talk about dissonant heritage: have a look at the <u>link</u>

## Kazanlak - Multi perspective approach for Adaptive reuse of Dissonant heritage

On 3 October 2025 a Bilateral exchange focused on "Adaptive reuse of Dissonant Heritage for a multi-perspective storytelling".

Participants from the cities of Cesena, Gdansk, Kazanlak, Krakow, Leipzig and Vila Nova de Cerveira were guided by the Kazanlak team to visit the **Buzludzha** Monument and exchange and learn during a collaborative workshop meeting facilitated by Nils Scheffler, ad hoc expert.

The visit at the **Buzludzha Monument** was led by **Dora Ivanova**, ULG coordinator of Kazanlak Municipality and **CEO of the Buzludzha Project** Foundation.

Meeting focused on:

- Approaches to define the reuse of dissonant heritage (do and don'ts, ethical aspects)
- Digital and artistic approaches to present the dissonant heritage and its different perspectives to the public
- Involvement of local communities in the reuse of dissonant heritage (focus on open/public spaces)
- Approaches dealing with and involving private dissonant heritage buildings/objects
- Obtaining funding for the adaptive reuse














## 4 - TESTING ACTIONS: THE EXPERIENCE OF CERVEIRA & CESENA

The Municipality of Vila Nova de Cerveira (PT) involves local students to create short films about the castle

Vila Nova Cerveira presented the result of their testing activity on **14 June 2025** to the local community.

The action called **Curtas no Castelo – Castle Short Movies** aimed to reestablish the Castelo D. Dinis as a **cultural and social hub for the community**.

The project was implemented following this stages:

- Specialised training to guide students through the process, with workshops covering aspects of film production, from writing scripts to editing;
- Guided visits to the castle to understand its history and get inspiration for the short-movies;
- Using accessible tools like small devices, students made their films and edit them with platforms, such as iMovie or Shotcut;
- Final presentation in Festival Curtas no Castelo, offering the community a chance to celebrate the students' work.









By providing opportunities for students to explore the castle's history and significance through filmmaking, this project encourages both creative expression and a deeper understanding of local heritage.

This Small-Scale Action had a **very** positive impact, not only because it heightened awareness of local heritage but also promoted the strengthening of social cohesion and identity within the community.

Besides this Small-Scale Action, the city developed a video [Link] - O Castelo é Nosso!" (The Castle is Ours), a powerful and emotional video where the people of Cerveira reclaim their iconic Castle as a symbol of identity, belonging, and community.


















## The testing actions

# in Cesena: a collaboration between municipality, Academia and citizens.

Cesena tested the concept of all intervention areas of the Integrated Action Plan through a set of testing actions that include: mapping the heritage of fascist period, opening the air raid shelter, production of a podcast of collective memory, workshops with students and artistic performances.

Within the framework of ARCHETHICS, the Municipality of Cesena established a sound collaboration with the Master's Degree Course in Architecture at the Department of Architecture of the University of Bologna.

Among other activities, a collection and systematisation of archival material dealing with urban and architectural heritage of Italy's fascist era in Cesena were organised. The activity has been coordinated by Professors Matteo Cassani Simonetti and Giulia Favaretto and developed by the students of the History and Restoration Course.

On **16 May 2025 an open event was organised** in the public library of Cesena "Bibblioteca Malatestiana" to present the research work to the local community.






## 6 - CREATING A DIGITAL ARCHIVE FOR ARCHETHICS

## ARCHETHICS co-designed a draft for a digital archive of Dissonant Heritage in Europe




The concept of the digital archive has been created with the support of the ad hoc expert **Marion Cugnet**.
