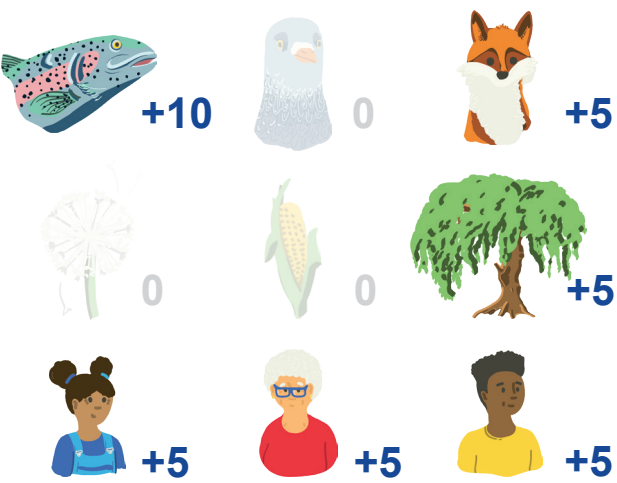


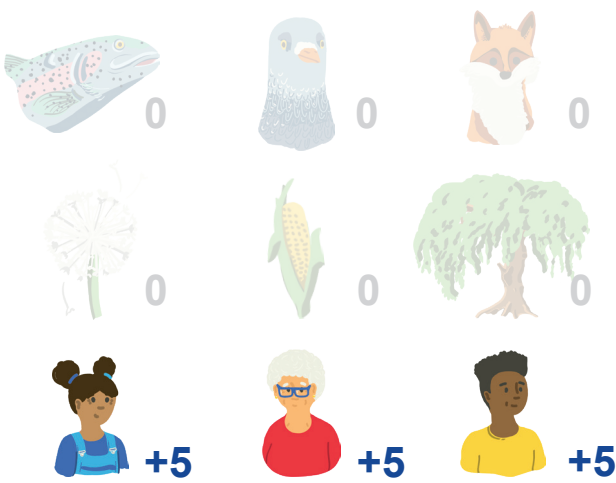
The wetlands have been brought back to their past glory, to soak up floods, and host nature’s own luxury resort.



The old forest has been saved from being cut down. Now it removes carbon from the air and gives wildlife a safe place to live.



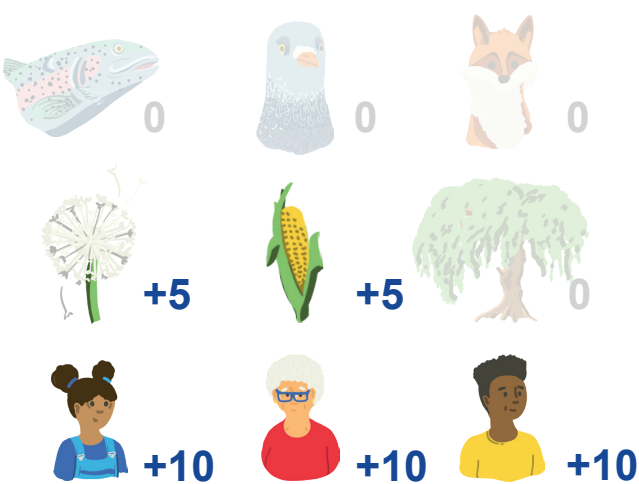
Solar panels are installed throughout the city, cutting energy bills and creating green jobs, sunshine never looked so profitable.



The polluted river has been cleaned, fish are back, and local tourism is swimming in success, turns out clean water pays off.



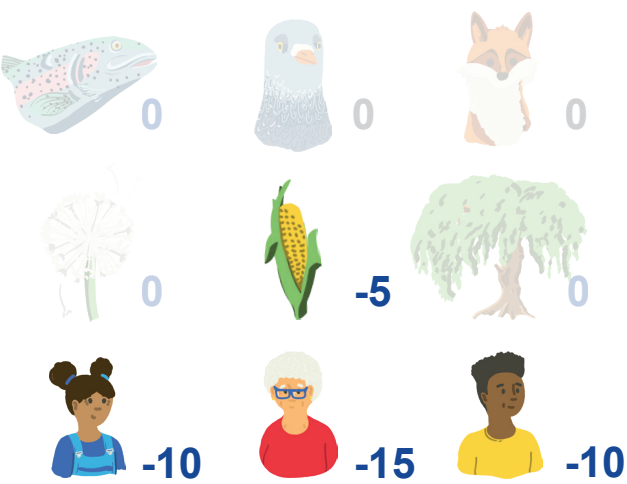
Community gardens have been established in vacant lots, providing fresh food and bringing neighborhoods together.



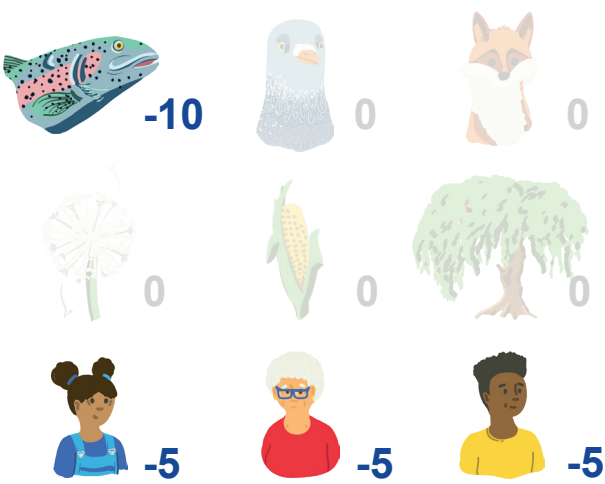
Public transportation has been expanded, easing traffic jams and clearing the air (and your lungs)!

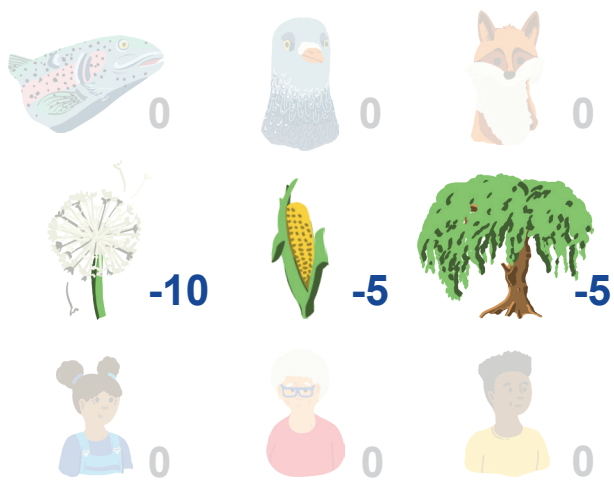

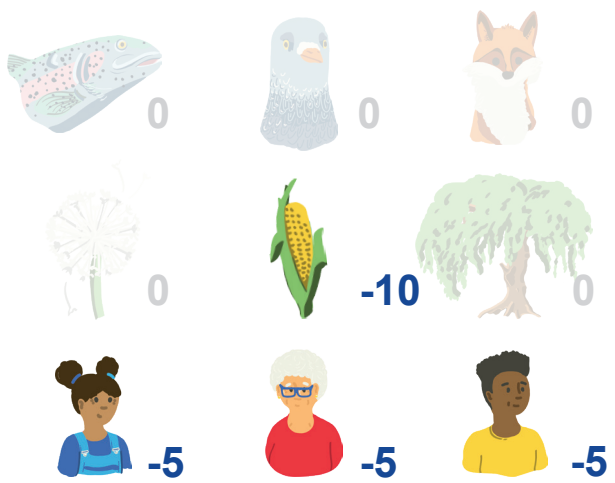

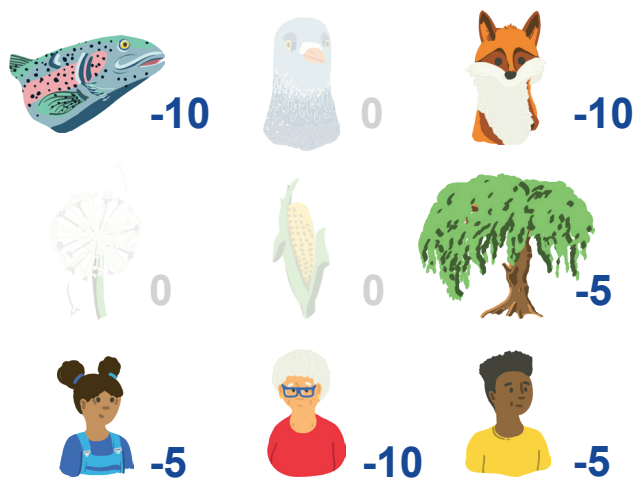
A fast-growing invasive plant takes over, overshadowing native species. Pollinators quickly buzz off.



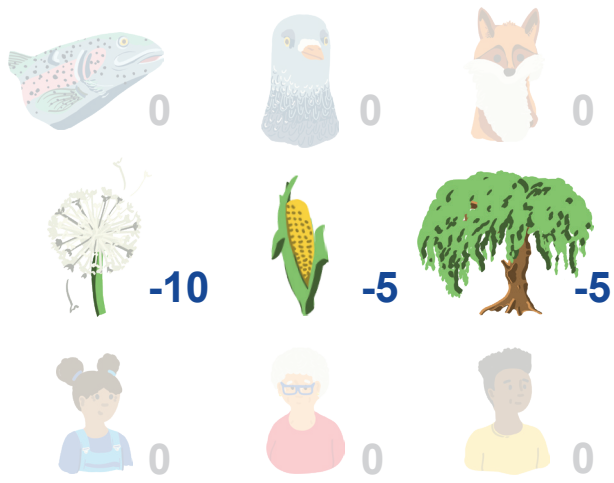
A pest outbreak hits crops, destroying entire fields and leaving behind damaged plants and a sense of hopelessness.



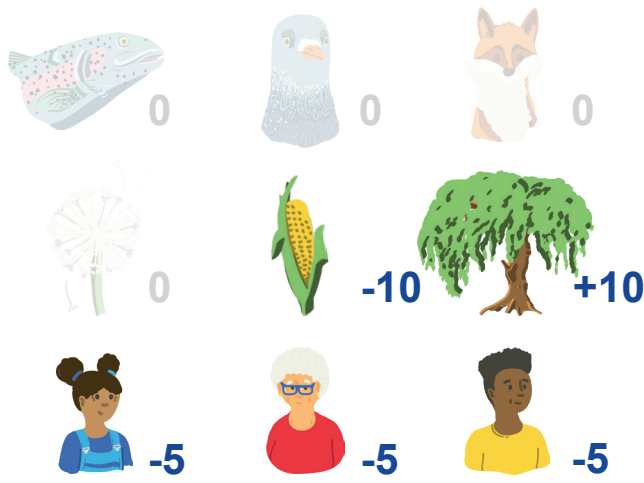
Temperatures rise beyond seasonal norms, drying out wetlands and pushing wildlife into heat stress. Staying ‘cool’ is harder than it looks.

A nasty tree fungus spreads quietly through the forest, making trees weaker from within while squirrels learn about structural integrity the hard way.



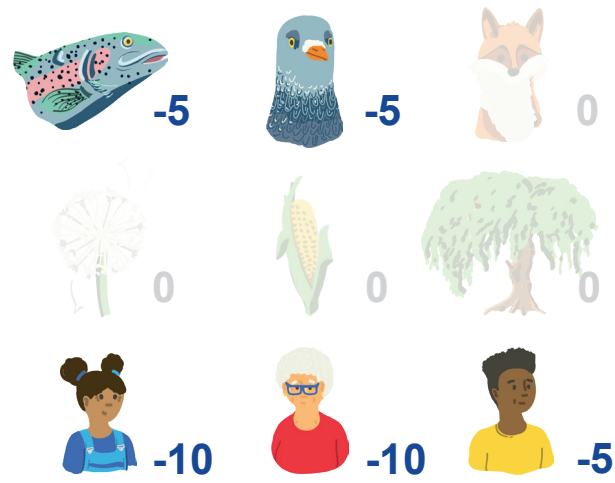
A containment failure releases chemicals into the river, clouding the water and mass killing fishes. The smell is described as “eggy bleach”.

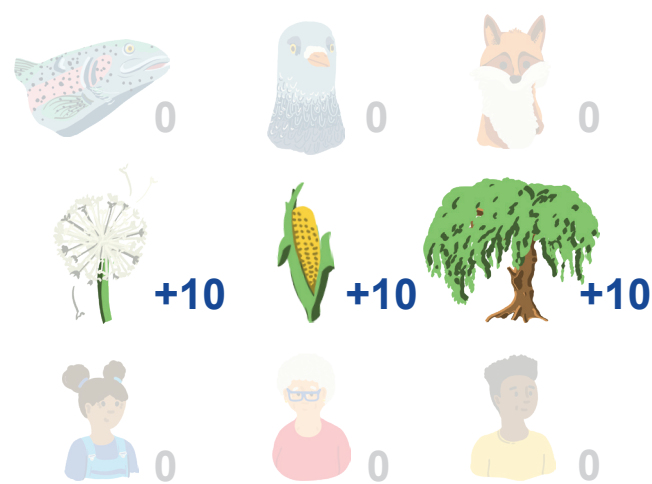

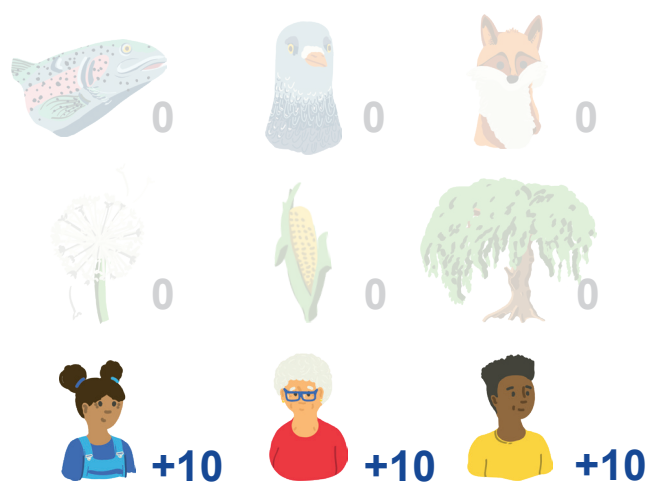
This spring's perfect rains trigger a regional super bloom, and plants remember what it's like to be colorful.



The rainy, cold summer kept hikers away, giving local wildlife and plants a peaceful season.



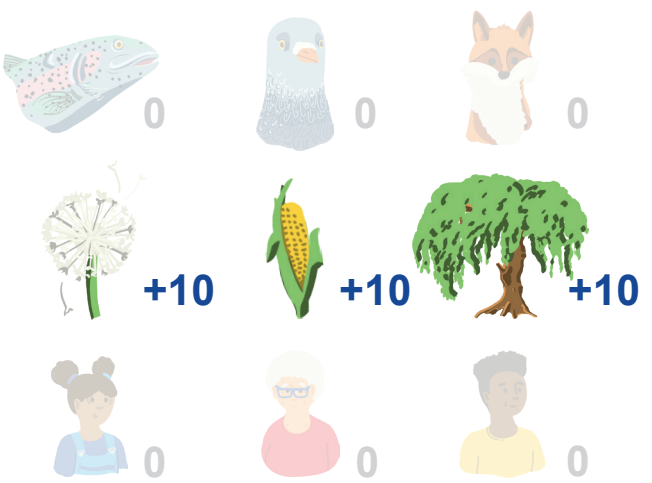
A medicinal plant is discovered, opening the floor to the development of new natural drugs.



Bees expand into rooftops and planters, and the city pops with flowers. The balcony experiment pays off.



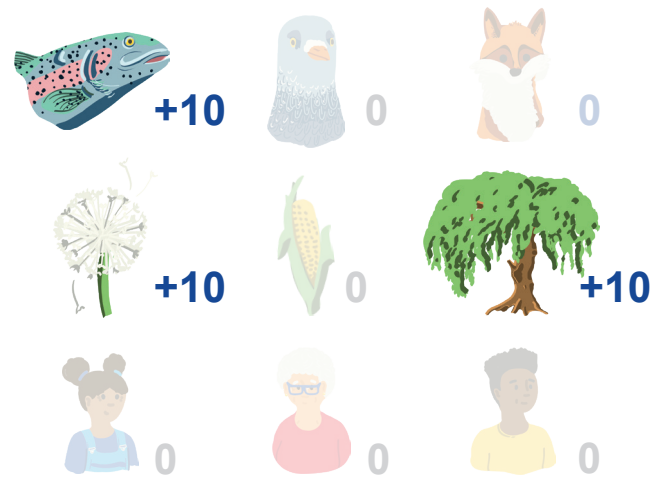
Moist weeks spark a fungal bloom underground. The soil just got better at its job.



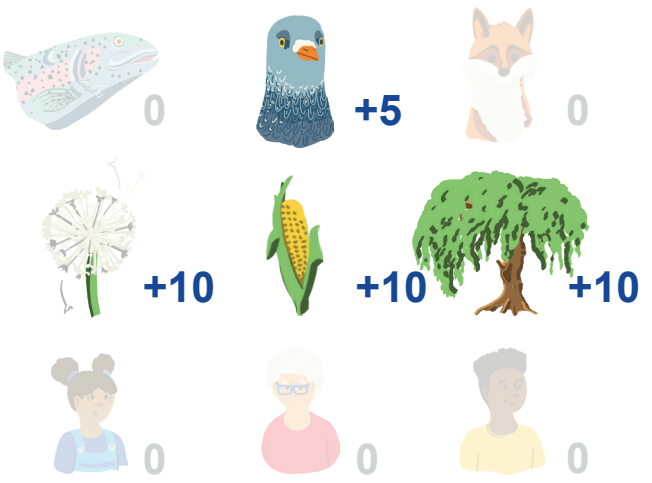
After a year of being ignored, an empty lot fills with grass, small bushes, and a few animals, looking like a nature documentary.



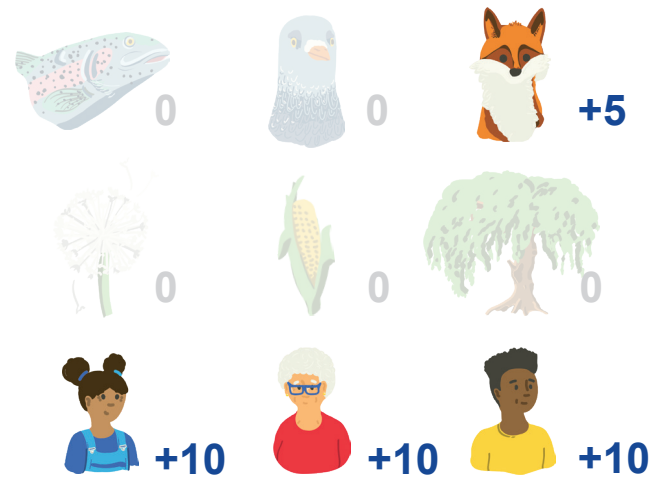
Warm spring days melt mountain snow into cold, clear streams. The whole valley takes a deep, satisfied breath.

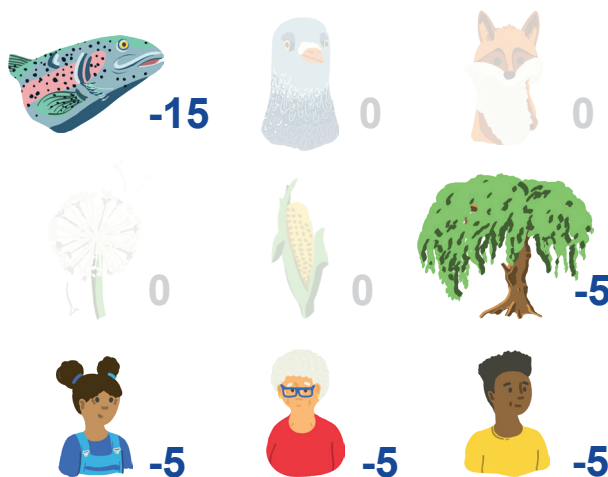

Green algae is taking over the lake, leaving fish short of breath and the water feeling a little... suffocating.



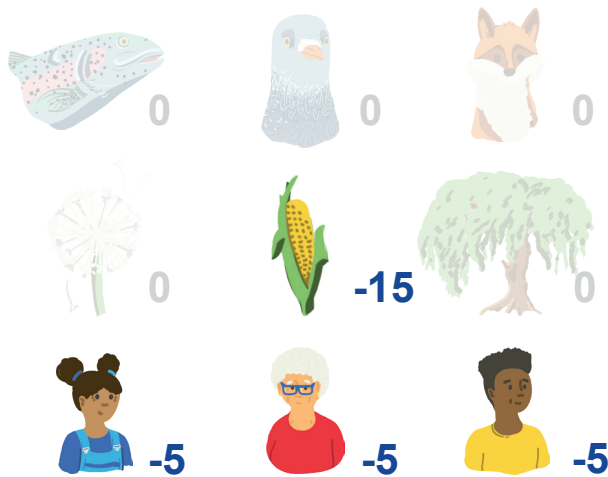
Nations fail to curb greenhouse gases, fueling climate chaos. Leaders agree... to keep arguing while the planet fries.



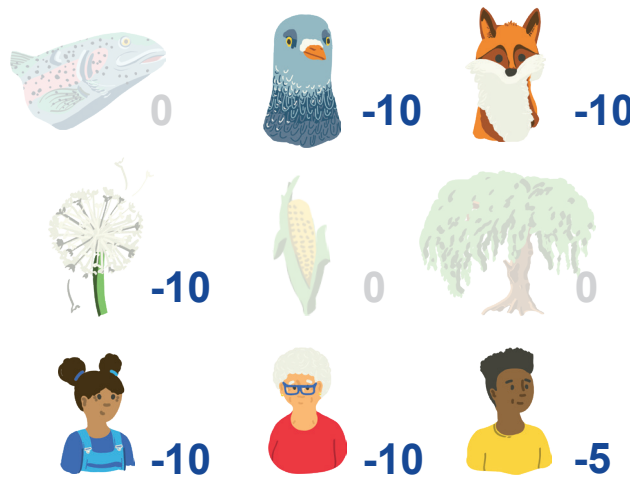
A rise in glass towers turns the skyline into a mirror and hundreds of birds mistake reflections for open air.

A cigarette tossed from a truck starts a grass fire. Smoke rapidly fills the air and animals flee toward the city.



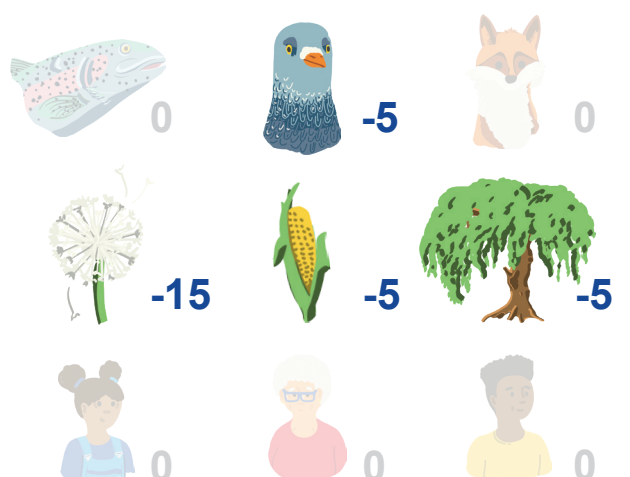
Under the cover of night, in a forest, an illegal operation works fast: chainsaws and trucks carry away the trees.

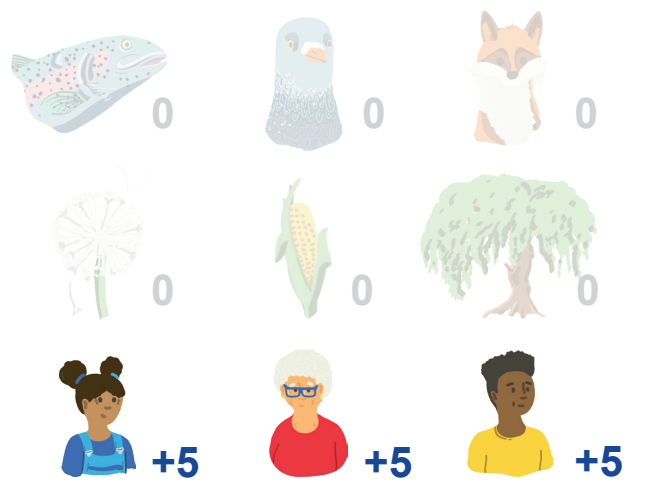
A fresh ocean breeze pushes away pollution, leaving clean, healthy air, at least for now.



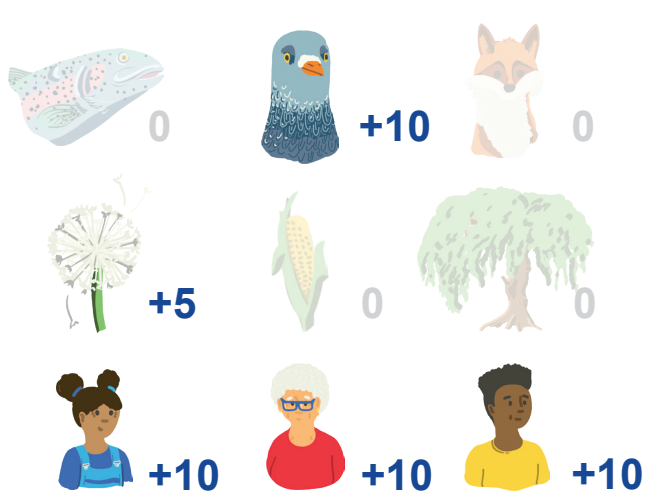
The forest grows thicker this year, more birds sing, and the moss spreads like a quiet blanket.



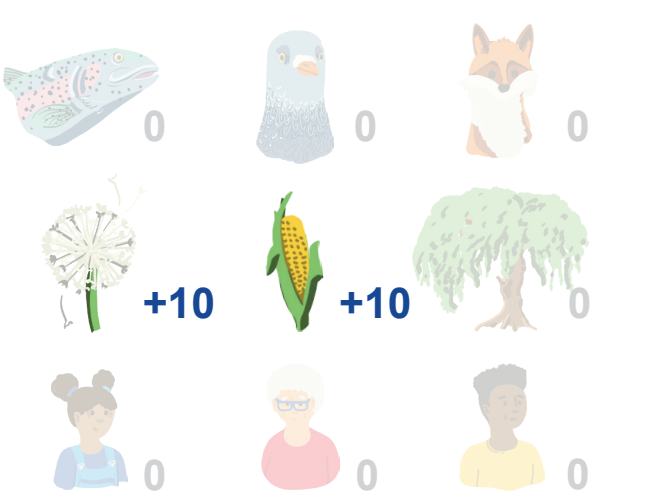
After years away, migratory birds fill the sky again and people look up more often.



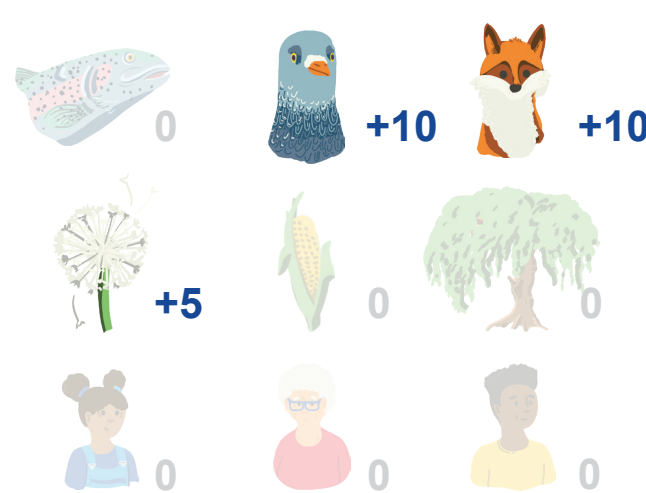
The city plants trees along every road, summer arrives softer this time.



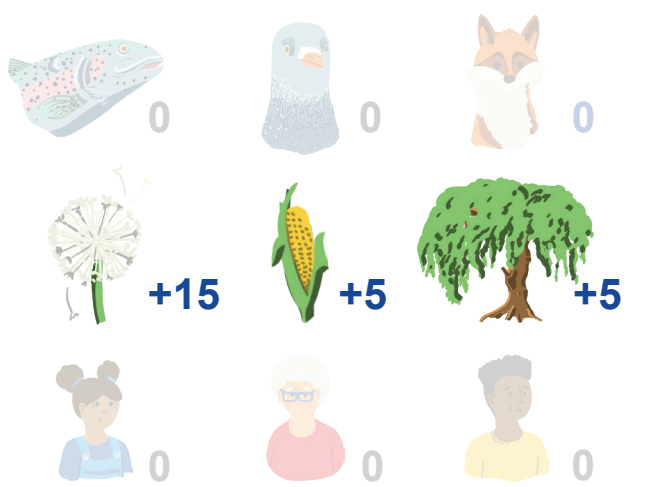
Community compost turns into rich humus, helping soil hold water and nutrients. Finally, soil that behaves as it should!

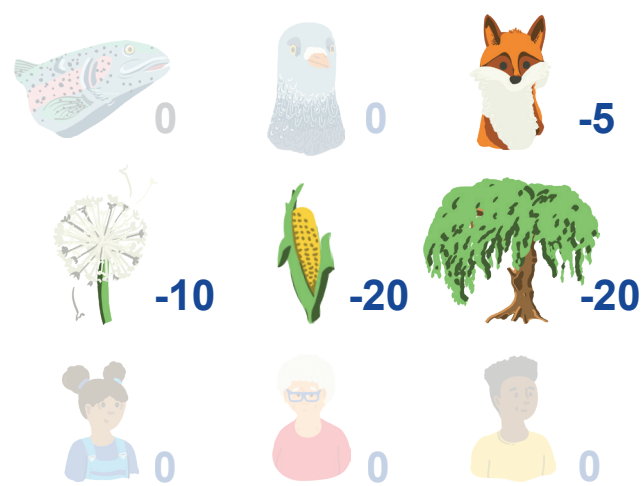

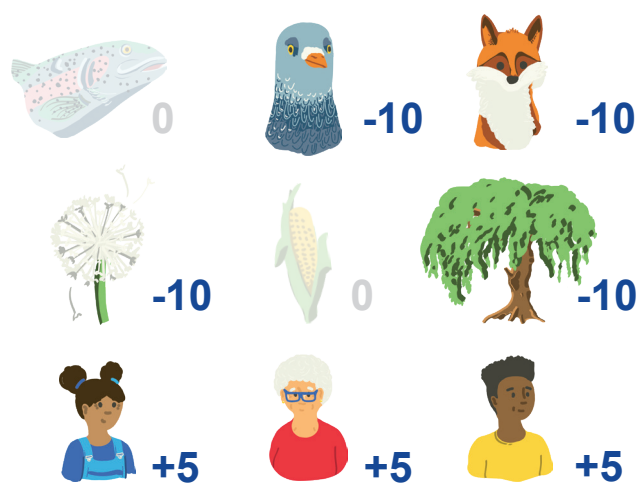
A quiet earthquake shakes the region, unexpected but not catastrophic... except for some unlucky roots.



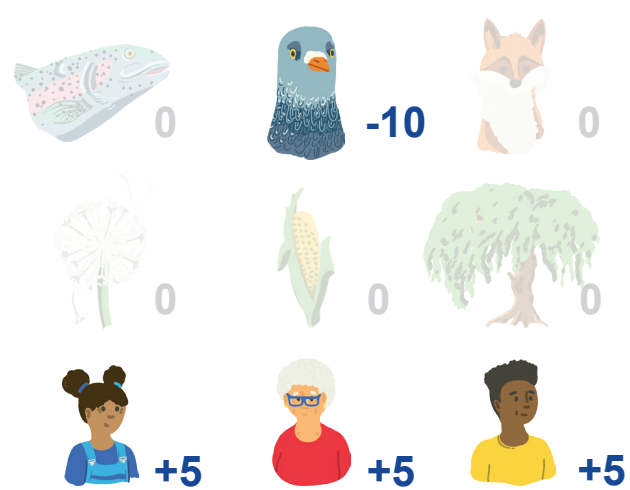
A trendy new hiking group arrives, stepping exactly where young plants hoped they wouldn't.



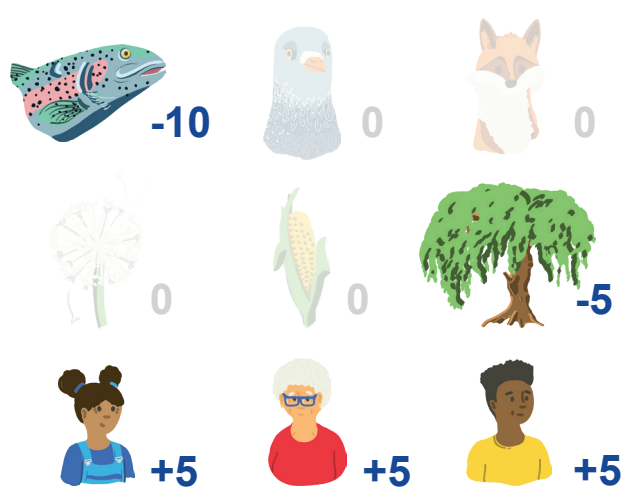
Someone installs bright solar garden lights. Plants are confused, insects delighted, birds deeply offended.



City cleaners trim every bush into perfect spheres. Birds lose their favorite hiding spots but humans love the symmetry.



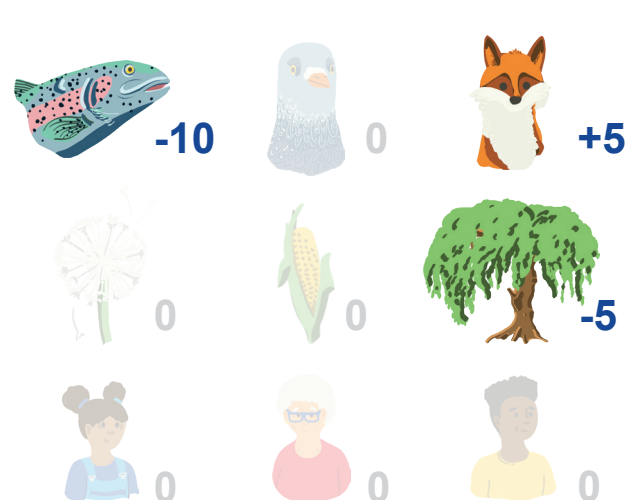
A new bridge opens over the stream, giving walkers great views and fish more trash to stress about.

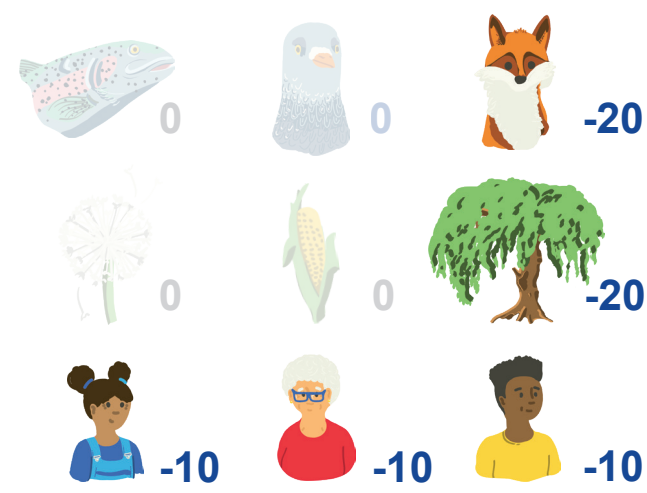

A research drone crashes into the forest and beeps loudly for hours, driving animals mad and drawing curious humans like moths.



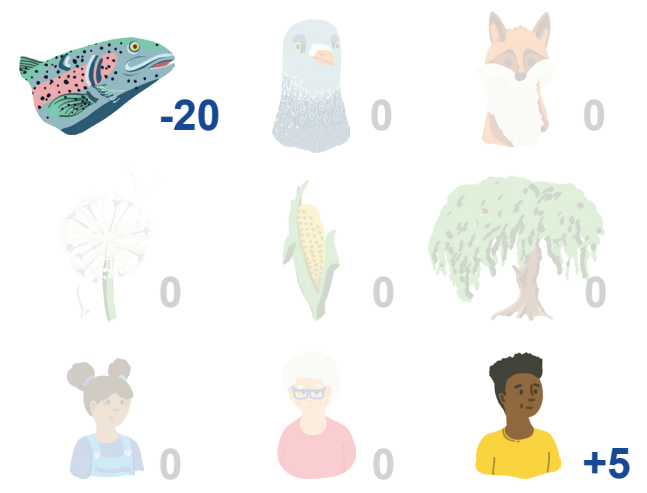
A strong wind pushes half the trash cans open, creating a feast for some and a tragedy for others.



A girl blows soap bubbles toward the trees, and several birds spend the next minute trying to figure out if they're edible.



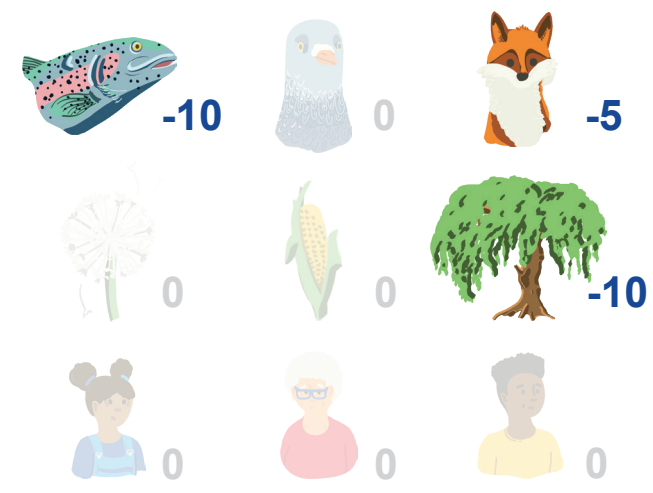
A man decides to practice his fishing throw, and the hook becomes a moving target for every curious creature.



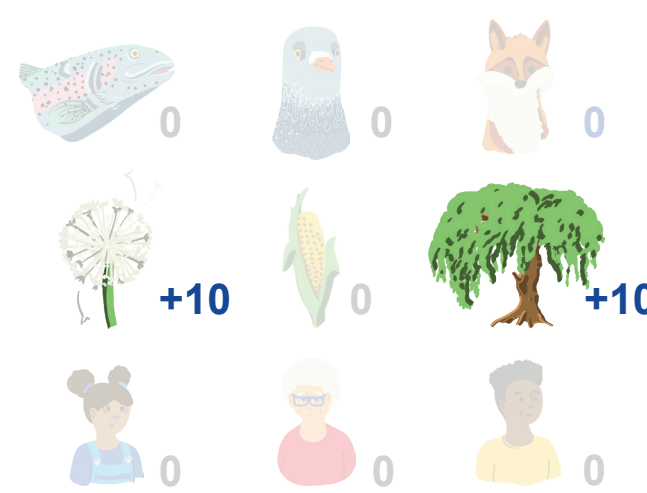
A picnic table collapses on one side, surprising everyone except the ants who saw it coming.



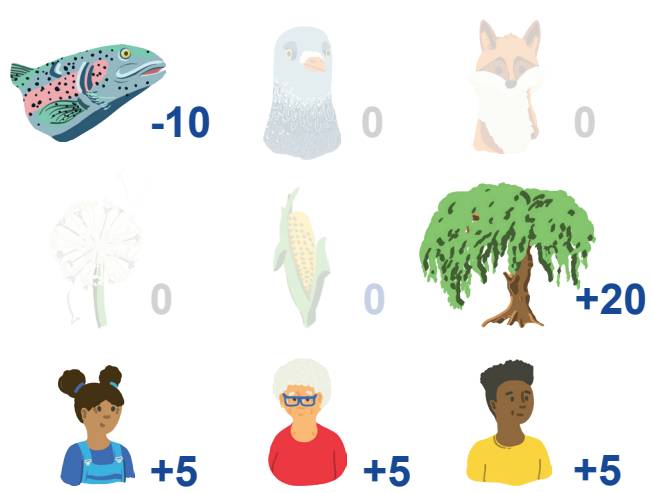
The river brings in a pile of leaves from upstream, annoying everything that wants clean water.



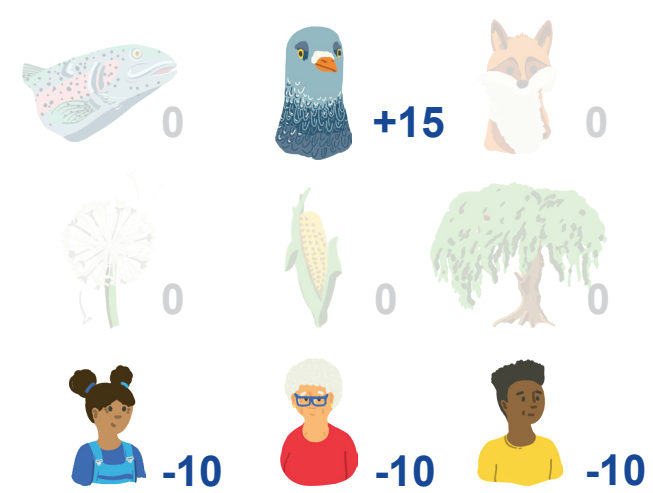
A water sprinkler in a public garden gets stuck pointing in one direction and ends up making one patch of plants ridiculously happy.

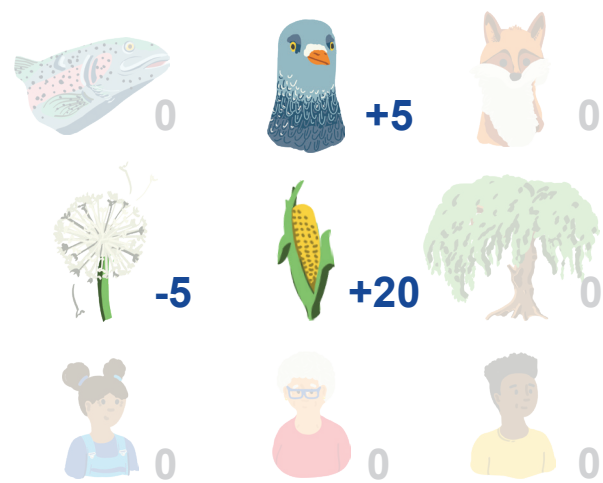

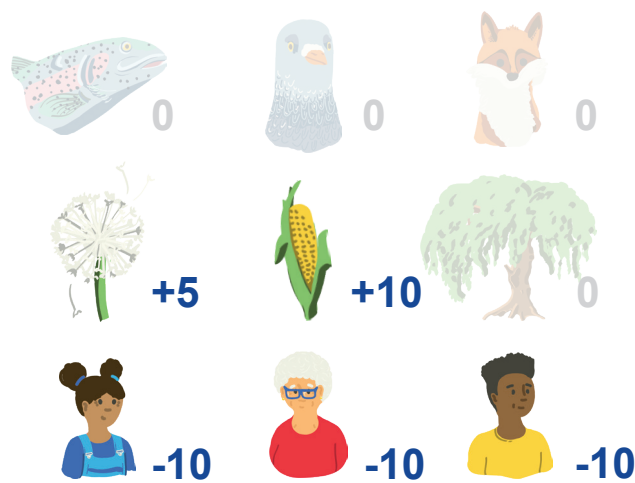
A farmer spreads extra fertilizer on the field, helping the crops grow tall while the wild plants look on in fear.



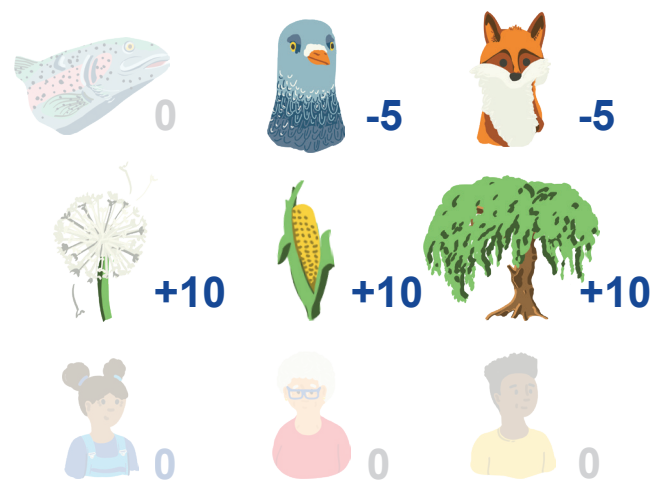
Park staff cut the grass too short, helping sprouts grow but ruining the hiding spots for everyone else.



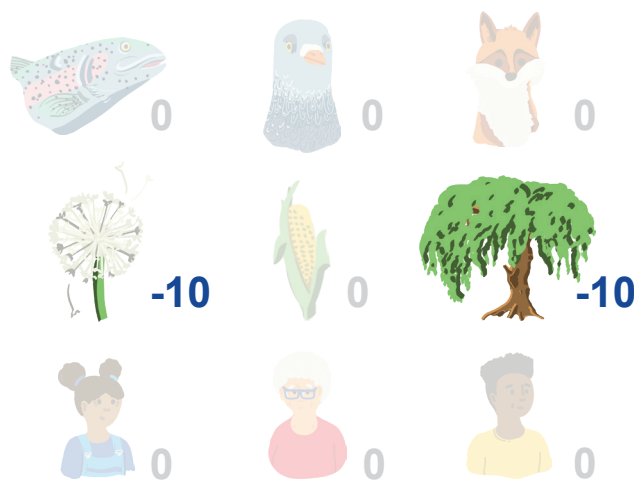
A pile of compost heats up more than expected, drawing in happy insects and sending away anything that hates the smell.

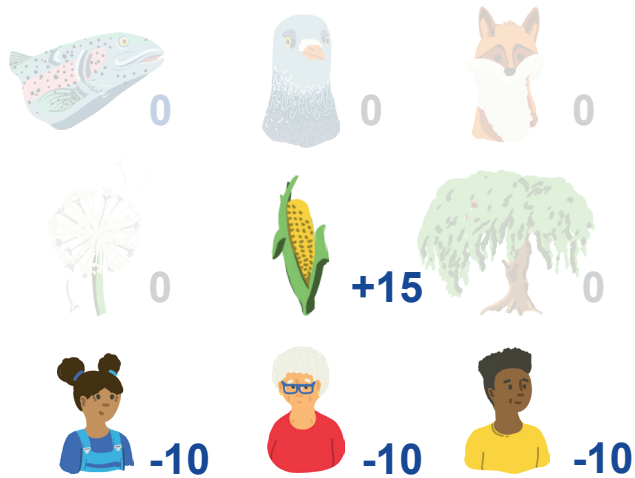

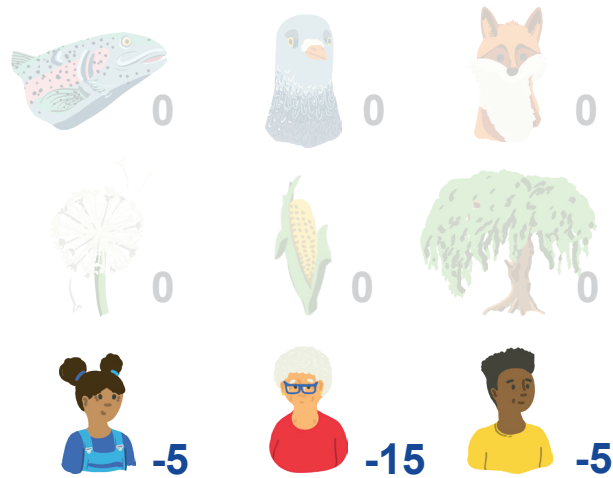
A strong wind scatters hundreds of plastic bags into the sky. Birds spend the day fighting them like very slow enemies.



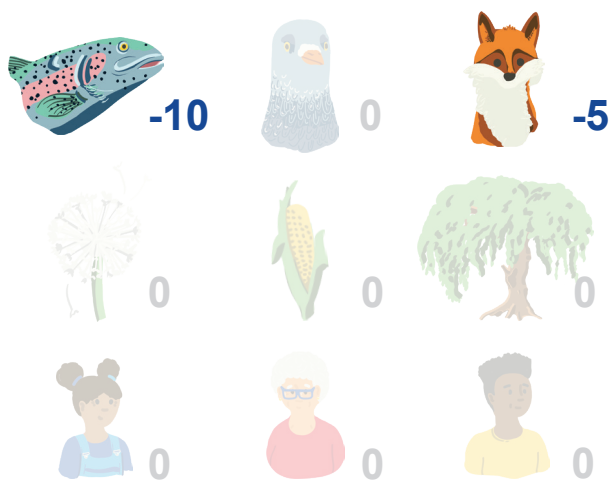
After a bright mysterious green rain, crops grows three times faster, and everything else just looks deeply worried.



A giant cloud of black flies appears and follows the grandmas around for hours. They swear they didn't do anything to deserve this.



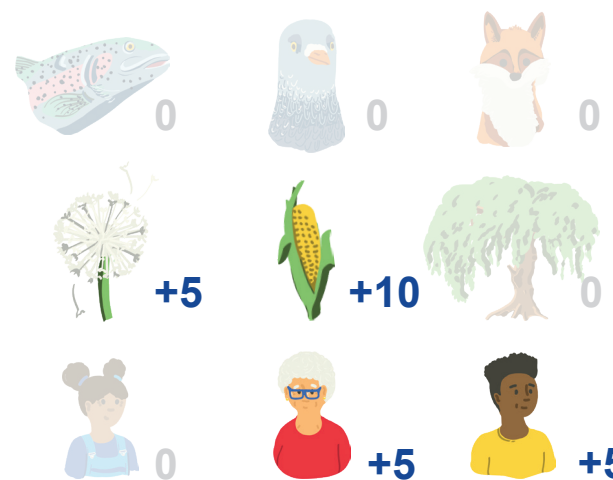
A rusty pipe upstream bursts and sends warm, bubbly water into the river. Free jacuzzi!



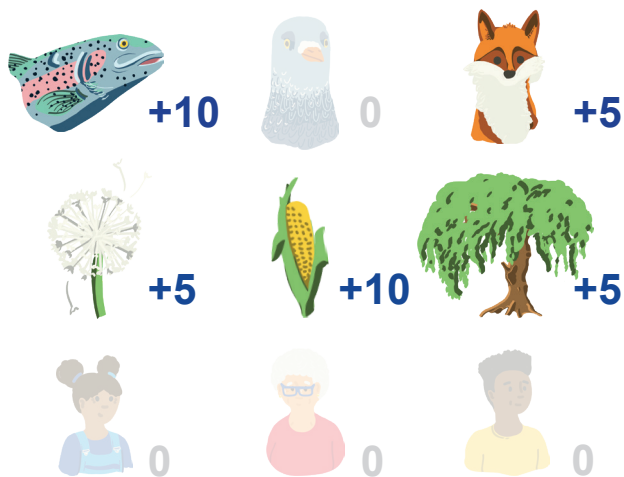
A planned fireworks show is called off due to missing permits.



A local gardening class meets to learn about high-quality compost, enriching the field's soil.



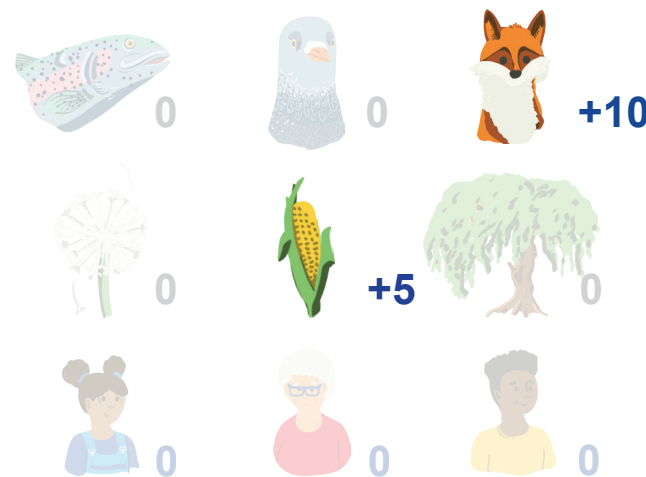
A surprise burst of sunshine boosts the plants' growth, the fishes prepare for sauna!

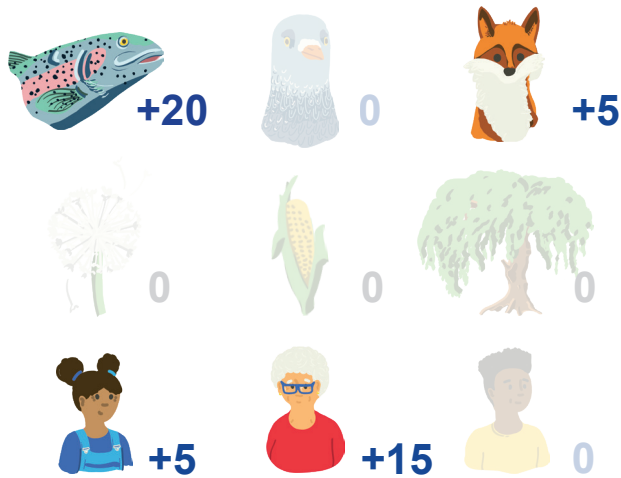

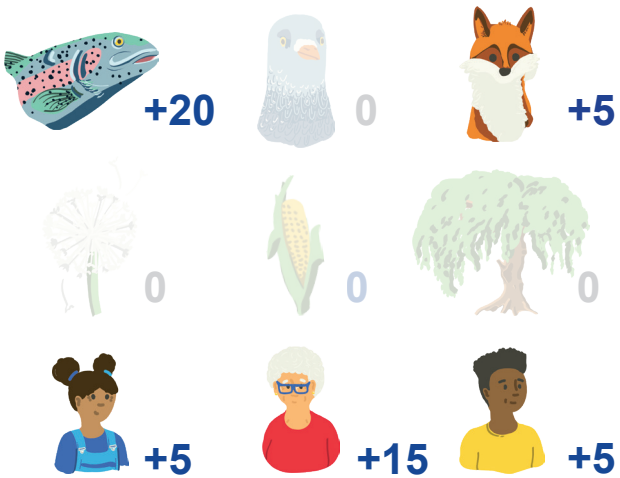

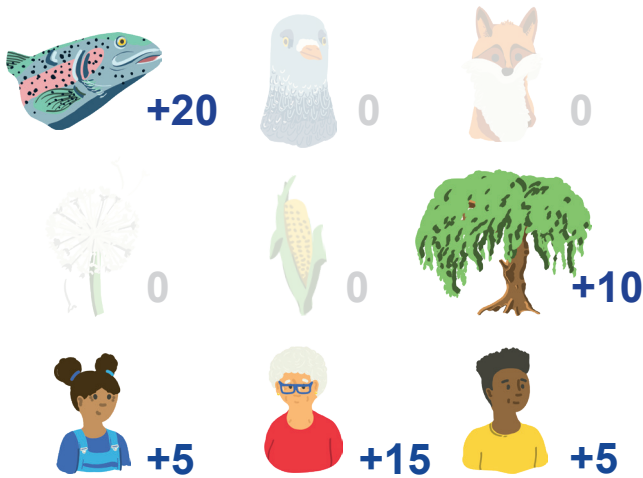
Volunteers pick up river trash, so the fish can stop dodging soda cans and the elderly can enjoy a walk in the nature.
