In these thematic sessions, discover the local actions carried out by URBACT cities to make a change on common challenges, and get inspired from them.

Each session builds on the actions implemented by different cities on a selected topic. These sessions showcase collaboration in practice, and the impact of URBACT Action Planning Networks on driving real change.

Session 1 Local economy

Many local economic challenges do not appear as sudden crises. They unfold quietly: talent leaves, city centres lose everyday life, new forms of work reshape neighbourhoods, and inequalities widen. This session is for city practitioners aiming to act earlier and more deliberately on these slow-moving changes. Drawing on the experience of six URBACT Action Planning Networks— [C4TALENT](#), [Cities@Heart](#), [Residents of the future](#), [Cities After Dark](#), [Remote-IT](#), [TechDiversity](#)— the session explores how cities are rethinking local economic development in practice. Participants will gain concrete insights into people-centred, place-based and governance-driven approaches that focus on everyday users rather than short-term promotion or attraction.

Session 2 Digital transition

How can we keep up with the pace of digital evolution while ensuring that everyone can benefit and that no-one is left behind? This session builds on insights and experience of the URBACT Action Planning networks [DIGI-INCLUSION](#), [METACITY](#), [NextGen YouthWork](#) and [TechDiversity](#) and will explore how cities are harnessing the benefits of technology and working to ensure that everyone benefit from the opportunities offered by the digital world through an interactive exchange between participants and representatives from city networks working on tech, inclusion and how we build the bridge between them.

Session 3 Nature-based solutions

As cities face climate change, biodiversity loss, and the pressure of urban sprawl, Nature-Based Solutions (NBS) offer an holistic approach that benefits both people and the environment. Beyond ecological gains, NBS create jobs, foster social innovation, and support resilient local economies. Learn from the URBACT Action Planning Networks [BiodiverCity](#), [Re-Gen](#), and [GreenPlace](#) how cities are renaturing spaces through biodiversity conservation, restoring urban–peri-urban connections, and promoting sustainable mobility. Explore brownfield regeneration, soil sealing mitigation, adaptive land reuse, and sustainable urban farming. Discover key tools and resources such as the Nature-Based Solutions Knowledge Hub, URBACT's Good Practices and the Urban Agenda Partnership on Greening Cities.

Session 4 Health and wellbeing

Drawing on experiences from cities across Europe involved in the URBACT networks [One Health 4 Cities](#), [Breaking Isolation](#) and [Re-Gen](#), this session presents concrete approaches to tackling social isolation, empowering youth through urban regeneration, and advancing integrated health strategies. Speakers will share a three-step story: a short pitch on the public challenge they face, a visual snapshots of existing policies and gaps, and the innovative solutions developed through cross-city collaboration. Participants will gain practical insights and inspiration for strengthening social cohesion, youth participation and integrated urban policies.

Session 5 Mobility

This session brings together cities from five URBACT Action Planning Networks, [S.M.ALL](#), [ECONNECTING](#), [SCHOOLHOODS](#), [PUMA](#) and [Beyond the Urban](#), to explore what it takes to move from mobility plans to real-life implementation. Moving beyond "best practices", the discussion focuses on lived experience: political choices, governance dilemmas, difficult trade-offs and lessons learned when strategies and action plans meet reality. In a conversational, talk-show-style format, the session explores what changed, what remained challenging and what happens after an URBACT project formally ends in terms of ownership, governance and long-term implementation.

Session 6 Welcoming cities

This session looks at how municipalities incorporate civic participation to address declining trust in democracy, drawing on the experiences of the cities of Genk and Timișoara. Genk presents a new model for living together in a superdiverse city developed through the URBACT network [Agents of Co-Existence](#) while Timișoara showcases the bottom-up vision for becoming a Welcoming City through the URBACT network [WELDI](#), based on human rights-based migrant integration. Together, these cases highlight the capacities needed in municipalities to use civic participation to address contested issues and re-build civic trust.

Session 7 Social data management

How can cities use social data to shape fairer, healthier, and more inclusive urban policies? This session brings together cities from the URBACT networks [Cities@Heart](#), [U.R. Impact](#), [One Health 4 Cities](#) and [NextGen YouthWork](#) to explore how data on well-being, civic participation, health, and youth engagement can be collected, managed, and turned into action. Participants will hear practical city stories and engage in an open discussion on how social data can inform policy, strengthen citizen participation, and align with the Sustainable Development Goals.

Session 8 Urban planning

How can urban planning move beyond traditional land-use to actively shape fairer, greener, and more connected cities? This session brings together cities from the URBACT networks [Cities@Heart](#), [METACITY](#) and [Beyond the Urban](#) to explore how integrated planning can deliver on digital, environmental, and social priorities. Participants will hear how cities are using data, participatory tools, and innovative governance to plan vibrant centres, sustainable mobility, and inclusive digital futures.

Session 9 Greening urban economies

This session explores how green urban economic transformation takes place in practice. Through concrete experiences from the URBACT Action Planning Networks [LET'S GO CIRCULAR!](#), [GreenPlace](#), [In4Green](#), [COPE](#) and [EcoCore](#), it examines concrete actions, key achievements and ongoing challenges. The discussion highlights how change unfolds over time through the interaction of local policies, public and private investments and everyday practices, offering practical insights into what enables greener and more resilient urban economies.

Session 10 Gender equality

How can gender equality be embedded in everyday local policy and practice? This interactive session brings together cities at different stages of gender mainstreaming to share concrete approaches, tools and lessons learned. Drawing on experiences from the URBACT networks [FEMACT-Cities](#) and [GenProcure](#), cities will show how ambition is translated into action across areas such as data, procurement, communication and participation – and what others can take away for their own cities.

Session 11 Youth

Today's youth face many stereotypes, from high expectations of digital competences, a strong sense for a healthy work-life balance, striving for meaningful school and work careers, down to prejudices of short attention spans and overprotection. While young people face a rapidly changing world, the real question is whether the world is changing to meet their needs. The YOUTH FLASH talk show, drawing on experiences from the URBACT Action Planning Networks [NextGen YouthWork](#), [Re-Gen](#) and [SCHOOLHOODS](#), explores how youth work can connect with young people's digital realities, create welcoming spaces in public life, and empower them to move confidently and independently in the city. Participants will gain insights into co-creating a vibrant, inclusive future with and for youth, supporting their wellbeing and their role as active shapers of our cities.

Session 12 Storytelling for citizens' engagement

Urban change is full of stories, but some of the most important ones are also the hardest to tell. Cities face complex challenges: climate action, social inclusion, democratic participation, health, heritage and long-term transformation. These processes are rarely linear, involving uncertainty, negotiation, trade-offs and slow, sometimes invisible change, realities that are difficult to communicate and often left out of official narratives. This interactive session asks: when a story is hard to tell, is it the story itself, or the format? In a live conversation, four URBACT networks ([ARCHETHICS](#), [Agents of Co-Existence](#), [One Health 4 Cities](#), [Cities for Sustainability Governance](#)) share one challenging story each and explore with the audience how visual, written, audio and digital formats can make these hard stories more meaningful and engaging, positioning storytelling as a strategic tool for urban change.
